Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriation Act

Signed: March 6, 2020

This is an \$8.3 billion supplemental appropriation for federal agencies - the Department of Health and Human Services, the State Department and the Small Business Administration. This funding has various dates for expenditure.

- Department of Health and Human Services - \$6.2 Billion
 - Public Health and Social Services Emergency Fund - \$3.4 billion
 - research and development of vaccines, procurement of medical supplies
 - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention - \$1.9 billion
 - state and local response efforts
 - National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease - \$836 million
 - research
 - Food and Drug Administration - \$61 million
 - development and review of vaccines, etc.
- Small Business Administration - \$20 million
 - disaster loan programs
- Telehealth Services - \$500 million
 - Medicare waiver for telehealth services
- International Efforts - \$1.6 billion
 - U.S. Agency for International Development - \$986 million
 - Global health programs, humanitarian assistance, economic stabilization
 - U.S. State Department - \$264 million
 - Embassy operations, emergency evacuations
 - Center for Disease Control - \$300 million
 - global disease detection and emergency response efforts
