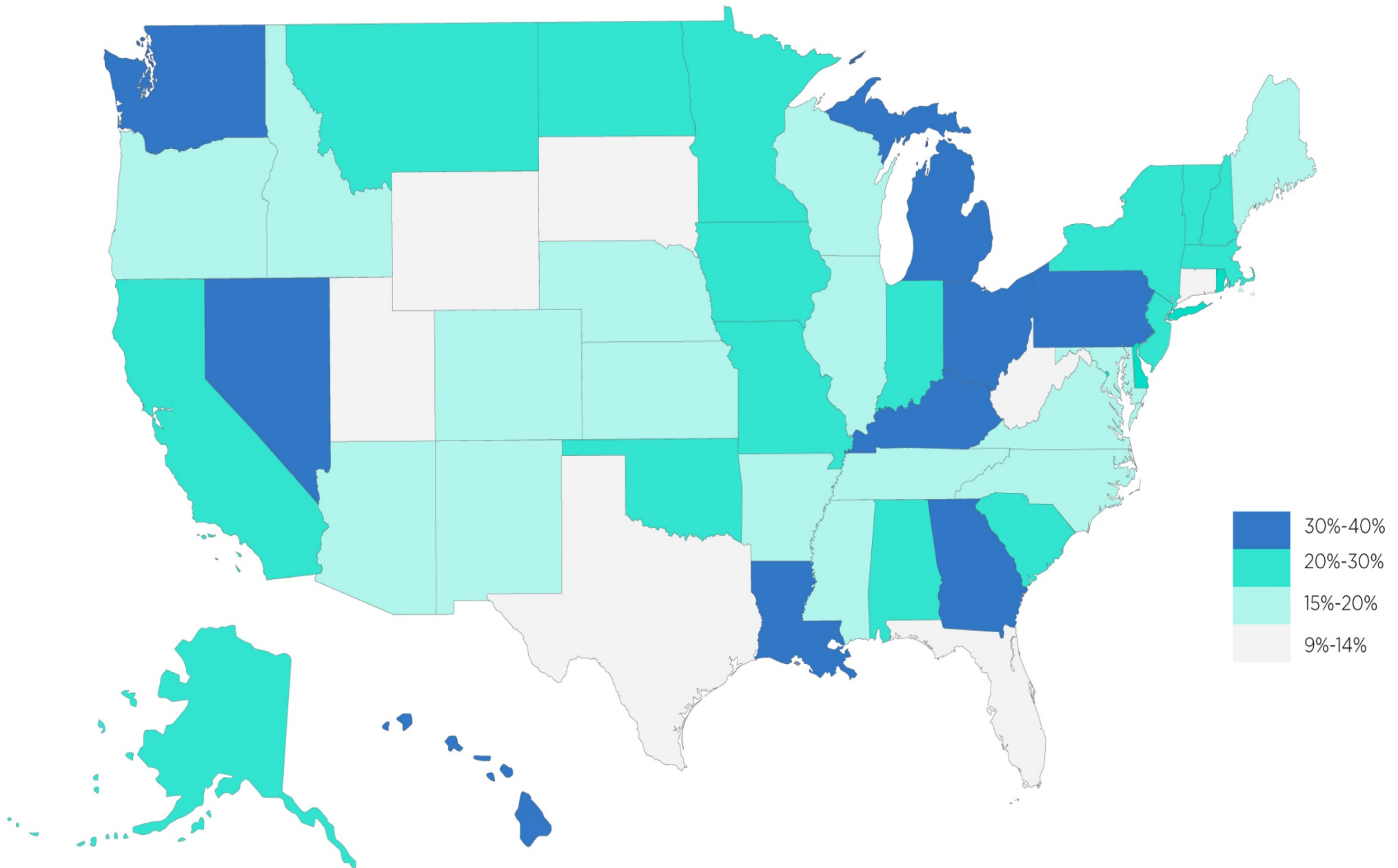


Revenue Loss for Cities, Boroughs, Towns and Townships as a Share of Total Own-Source Revenue by State, 2020
